2024 CDS Central Valley and San Luis Obispo Chapter Challenge

The Central Valley / San Luis Obispo Challenge is open to CDS Members that enter and compete in both the Central Valley Chapter CDS show and the San Luis Obispo Chapter show in 2024.

There is no fee to enter the Chapter Challenge. Just complete the requirements outlined below.





Ribbons and prizes will be awarded to the highest combined scores for the Open, Adult Amateur and Junior/Young Rider divisions. Eligible classes include Training through FEI Level Tests (Intro and Freestyle tests excluded.)

To be eligible for the award the entrant must ride in both the Central Valley and SLO Chapter shows in the 2024 competition year. Scores need to be earned on the same horse/rider combination, riding the same level and test in both shows. The winners will be determined after the conclusion of the last show.

SHOW RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION PLEASE READ CAREFULY

1. ENTRY ACCEPTANCE:

- All entries must be received or submitted and paid online by the closing date listed in the prize list to be considered on time. Show management may close entries early if the show fills prior to closing date. Entries submitted after the show is full will go on the wait list. Competitors will be advised of their entry standing via an entry confirmation sent from confirmations@foxvillage.com. Entries submitted that are not accepted will be returned and refunded in full.
- Entries must be filled out completely and have fees enclosed. 2024 version of CDS Agreement AND LDV Waiver must be signed by rider, owner, trainer, and if need coach. *Minors (riders under 18 years old) must have the parent or guardian sign the forms.
- No numbers will be issued without completed entries, full payment, signatures, fees and CURRENT copies of ALL registration cards.
- All entries must include an emergency contact name and number for rider or any other person that will be mounted on show grounds.
- Management reserves the right to accept conditionally or cancel any entries, disqualify riders as exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and cancel or combine classes.
- Online entry available at FoxVillage.com. Late entries accepted online only when space allows.
- "Promise-to-Pay" entries not accepted by email, or phone. Late entries must be paid to be accepted.
- Mailed Entries: Make checks payable to Central Valley CDS.

- Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. This show accepts mailed and electronic online entries. Mailed entries are accepted based on the received date, and are only accepted on or after the opening date listed in the prize list. Online entries are accepted based on the date/time stamp of the paid submission. Should the show be over subscribed and the need to cut off entries prior to the closing date arise, entries received after the show fills will be notified and placed on a wait list. Ties regarding entries received at any time on the same day/time will be broken by lot prior to scheduling the show. Affected competitors will be notified and allowed to be present when the drawing of lot is performed. Entries not accepted will be returned and refunded in full.

2. Bio-Security Protocol

- Please note—this show has a BIO-SECURITY PROTOCOL.
 All Horses MUST provide documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhino pneumonitis) vaccinations within six months, and prior to 7 days of competition dates. Documentation must be submitted with show entry. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. See GR845.
- Show management must be notified if any vet is called to show grounds for any reason. Failure to notify show management may result in fine and/or being required to leave competition grounds.
- Show will have an Isolation Protocol in place. Any horse found to present a potential for transmittable disease will be required to follow the Isolation Protocol. Failure to follow Isolation Protocol may be fined and/or required to leave competition grounds.
- Bio-Security protocol does not negate the refund policy as outlined in this prize list.
- 3. SCRATCHES, CHANGES and CANCELLATIONS: It is the responsibility of the competitor to inform the show secretary (559) 978-2760 of intention to scratch. Refunds are given for scratches prior to closing date listed on this prize list, less the \$35.00 office fee. No refunds given after closing date. Cancellations: Shows will be held rain or shine. No refunds given due to weather conditions.
- 4. ENTRY CONFIRMATIONS: Entry confirmations will be emailed. Please ensure that your email is set to allow emails from confirmations@foxvillage.com. Competitors are responsible for reading and responding to the entry confirmation. If entry confirmation is not received by the closing date of the show, the competitor is advised to contact the show secretary.
- 5. **RIDE TIMES:** Times will be emailed and posted to Fox Village website (www.foxvillage.com), and posted on show grounds in a conspicuous place by noon the day prior to the start of the show and cannot change after that, except in compliance with GR830.5 It is the rider's responsibility to inform management if times are not received. Please do not assume lower levels will be run first, as may be necessary to run classes out of order of difficulty. Due to weather and other factors, upper levels may be scheduled earlier in the day than lower levels.

SHOW RULES AND GENERAL INFORMATION PLEASE READ CAREFULY

- **MANAGEMENT:** The Horse Show Management reserves the right to interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or arising out of any incident in the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the Horse Show Management and their decision will be final. The Horse Show Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally or cancel any entries, disqualify riders or exhibitors, prohibit exhibition of entries, and to cancel /award prizes, without claim to damage, to change, cancel or combine any classes, to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors, or to change rings or substitute officials. The judges decisions are strictly their own and the Management accepts absolutely no responsibility for those decisions. Management reserves the right to arrange for additional judges and to cancel, combine or amend any class, including but not limited to class awards, scheduling and location.
- WARM UP RINGS: NO ONE allowed on foot in the warm up arenas. Coaches must be outside the arena at all times.
- NON-COMPETE HORSES: Horses not competing in the show must be registered with the show office and will be given a number to be worn at all times when out of the stall or away from trailer. Entry form and signed CDS Agreement & facility waiver must be submitted, and appropriate fees must be paid prior to the horse being ridden. Failure to register and pay for schooling horse can result in doubling of entry fee. Non-compete horses are allowed in the warm-up as long as there is room and their presence is not disruptive. This determination will be made solely at the discretion of show management. There may be other areas on the grounds available for schooling purposes. No schooling of horses in or around competition arenas during the competition. After the completion of the competition, with permission of show management, competition arenas may be opened for schooling. Due to limited stabling, companion/noncompete horses may be restricted.

9. FREESTYLES:

Freestyle music must be able to be played via Bluetooth. Please give to Show Secretary upon check-in on show day. Sound check will be held daily at the first break.

- STABLING: Please contact La Dolce Vita Equestrian directly for stabling availability and payments. Robin (559) 681-0961.
- 11. **AWARDS:** Ribbons through 5th place. High Point Ribbon for each division, Open, Amateur & JR/YR.
- 12. **LUNGING:** Absolutely no lunging in the warm up arena. Lunging allowed in designated lunging arenas only.
- 13. **ARENAS and FOOTING:** Show arena is outdoors and is standard regulation size (20m x 60m) overall dimensions approx. 100' x 240'. Warm up arena is outside. Lunge ring available.
- 14. **VET & FARRIER:** On call. Phone numbers will be posted at the show office.
- 15. **EMT:** Qualified medical personnel are on the premises at all horse shows.
- 16. DOGS: Preferable that dogs stay at home, any dog on the property must be on leash at all times, and not allowed in indoor arena or near competition arenas. Please review USEF Rules GR1301.6.

"EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH."

RULES:

SHARPS CONTAINERS: GR1210.4 Competition management shall place a minimum of one sharps container per each competition, whether or not stabling is provided. Additionally, at least one sharps container per fifty occupied stalls for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments in convenient locations in barns housing competition horses. It is competition management's responsibility to replace such containers when full and dispose of them properly. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. Competition management will place a notice of this requirement either in its prize list or on a specific handout given to trainers on check in at the competition. If local law has different requirements, local law will prevail. Competitions failing to comply with placing the required number of containers on the show grounds will be considered in violation of the rules and may be subject to penalty as determined by the CEO or Executive Director and/or the Hearing Committee.

MOTORIZED VEHICLE STATEMENT: GR1301.7: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. (2024)


MORE RULES:

DR120 Dress:

WAIVING OF COATS: In locations with high average heat and humidity on the date of a competition, management can publish in their prize list that jackets will be waived for the duration of the competition. Alternatively, management can announce prior to or during a competition that competitors can show without jackets when extreme heat and/or humidity is forecast. This waiver applies to in all classes including FEI classes at National Competitions. However, competitors must wear protective headgear and a shirt with sleeves and collar, without neckwear, and without decoration except as described under .14 of the rule. T-shirts are not permitted. Members of the Armed Services or po-lice units may wear summer uniforms.

HELMET RULE EFFECTIVE APRIL 1, 2013: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse a any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tailcoat (only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hat covers (where applicable) and must otherwise conform to DR120 (see GR801).

What is the California Dressage Society?

RELEASE FROM LIABILITY

This RELEASE FROM LIABILITY is made and entered into by and between LA DOLCE VITA EQUESTRIAN CENTER, LLC ("LDV"); MICHAEL A. AND ROBIN L. DEBENEDETTO individually ("DEBENEDETTO"); and the following participant, hereinafter designated as "RIDER," or if RIDER is a minor, RIDER'S parent or legal guardian.

In return for the use today, and on all future days, of property, facilities, and services of LDV and DEBENEDETTO, RIDER, his heirs, assigns and legal representatives, hereby expressly and fully agree to the following:

- 1. RIDER acknowledges and understands that horseback riding is a sport which carries inherent risks of personal injury and property damage.
- 2. RIDER EXPRESSLY AGREES TO ASSUME ANY AND ALL RISKS INVOLVED IN OR ARISING FROM RIDER'S USE OF OR PRESENCE UPON DEBENEDETTO'S PROPERTY AND FACILITIES including, but not limited to, the following: the risks of death, bodily injury, property damage, falls, kicks, bites; collisions with vehicles, horses or stationary objects; fire and explosion; the unavailability of emergency medical care; and/or the negligence and/or deliberate act of another person.
- 3. RIDER agrees to hold LDV and DEBENEDETTO and all of their collective successors, assigns, subsidiaries, franchisees, affiliates, officers, directors, employees, volunteers, sponsors, advertisers or any of its agents completely harmless and free from responsibility and releases LDV and DEBENEDETTO from any and all liability of every nature and kind arising out of RIDER'S use of or presence upon DEBENEDETTO'S property and facilities.
- 4. RIDER agrees to waive the protection afforded by any statute or law in any jurisdiction whose purpose, substance and/or effect is to provide that a general release shall not extend to claims, material or otherwise, which the person giving the release does not know or suspect to exist at the time of executing the release. RIDER specifically waives the operation of California Civil Code § 1542 which reads as follows:

A GENERAL RELEASE DOES NOT EXTEND TO CLAIMS WHICH THE CREDITOR DOES NOT KNOW OR SUSPECT TO EXIST IN HIS OR HER FAVOR AT THE TIME OF EXECUTING THE RELEASE, WHICH IF KNOWN BY HIM OR HER MUST HAVE MATERIALLY AFFECTED HIS OR HER SETTLEMENT WITH THE DEBTOR.

5. RIDER agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless LDV and DEBENEDETTO from any and all claims, causes of action, damages, judgments,

- costs or expenses, including attorney fees, which in any way arises from RIDER'S use of or presence upon DEBENEDETTO'S property and facilities.
- 6. RIDER agrees to abide by all of the instructions, rules, and regulations of LDV and DEBENEDETTO.
- 7. RIDER is responsible for full and complete insurance coverages on himself, his horse(s), and his personal property.
- 8. RIDER'S horse shall be free from infectious, contagious, or transmissible diseases. LDV and DEBENEDETTO reserve the right to refuse horse if it appears not in proper health or is deemed dangerous or undesirable, all in the sole opinion of LDV or DEBENEDETTO or their agents.
- 9. This contract is non-assignable and non-transferable and is made and entered into at Clovis, California, and shall be enforced and interpreted under the laws of California.

The undersigned has full power, authority, capacity, and right without limitation to execute, deliver and perform this release. I hereby acknowledge that I have read this Release of Liability and know and understand its contents.
